- Dr. Frank's favorite saying is "every student is a gem in the raw."

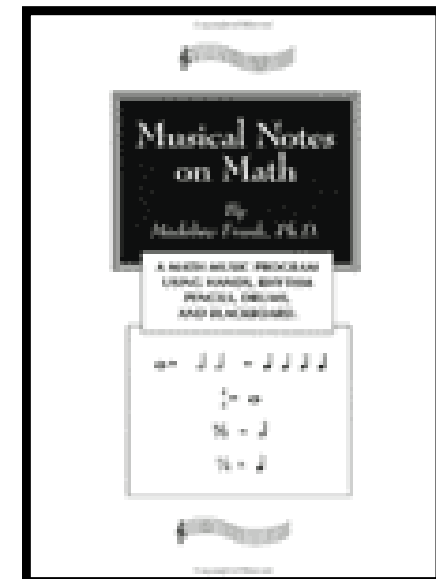
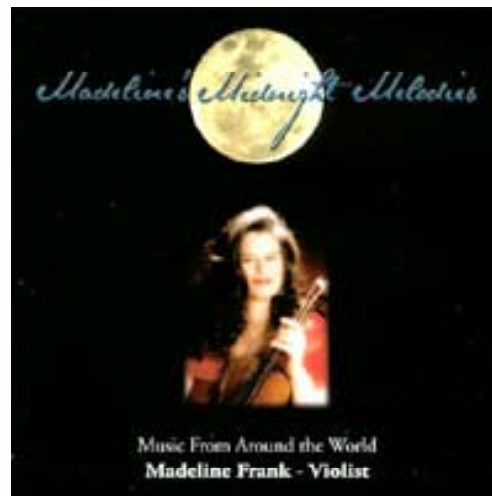
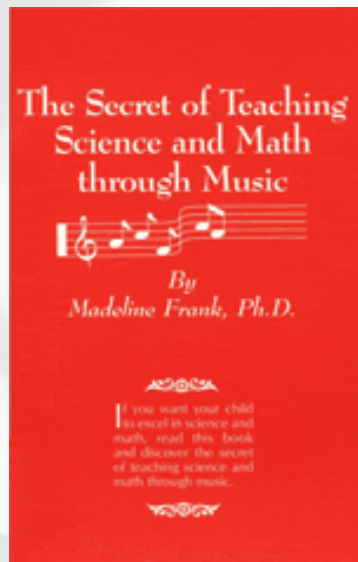
