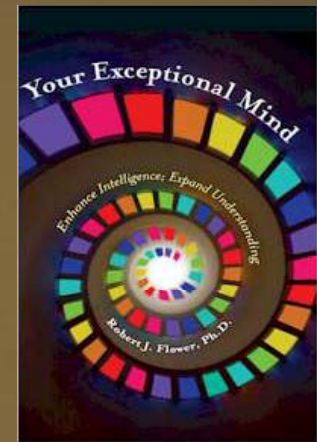

 - Beliefs/Concepts
 - Expression/Communication
- Organization
 - Laws Mirror
 - Order Details
 - Priority Whole
- Function
 - Physical (Material)
 - Mental
 - Emotional
 - Intuitive/Spirit

James Flick, co-founder of DNA, states in his book *Chaos*, that nature is comprised of four basic characteristics, namely Creativity, Organization, Function, and Polarity.

systems format.

The Environmental Mind

- Institutional, Cultural, “Accepted” Thinking, Focused upon self and others and places and events. Some purpose. Subjectively open.

The Exceptional Mind

- Factual, Objective, Totally Open, Impersonal.
- Purpose Oriented (Potential).
- Ideas and Ideals Centered.

3. Neutral (0) Direction

Natural Thinking

Variant Principles

Relates Directly to viewing things as one sees.

1. Fear and Anger
2. Self-Deception
3. Ignorance/Confusion/Doubt
4. Ego

The Human Character Formula

A Awareness [A] (Information)

+B Beliefs [B] (Concepts)

=C Character [C] (Communication)

Core Human Dynamics

(Our Natural Motivation)

1. Power
2. Control
3. Acceptance/Inclusion
4. Uniqueness/Exclusiveness/One-Upmanship
5. Attention/Recognition-Seeking
6. Self-Interest
7. Judgment/Values/Appraising
8. Motivation/Drive/Will

The Six Ways Humans Organize

1. Models, Laws, Rules
2. Procedures, Methods, Processes
3. Measures, make Judgments and Appraisals, Priority

6. Integrate, Synchronize Combine

Steps for optimizing Comprehension

Clarity, and Reaching our Potential

1. Objectivity, Openness, Flexibility
2. Follow a Proven Plan
3. Be Impersonal
4. Unconditionality, Selflessness
5. Use the Principle of Development as Resolution and a Life Mission
6. Synthesize and Integrate events and Information
7. Use Weaknesses as Potential
8. Use the Mirror/Truth Seeking
9. Stay focused on Values, Priorities and Self Images

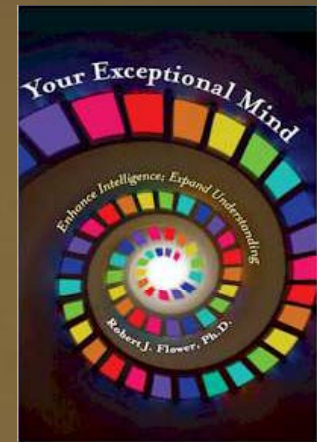
