Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as an elementary education teacher; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as an elementary education teacher in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

### EdS in Educational Leadership and Administration (Principal Preparation)

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Walden's Education Specialist in Educational Leadership Administration (Principal Preparation) program is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a school principal in Maryland. Students should contact the Maryland State Department of Education to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a school principal; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a school principal in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## Master of Arts in Teaching

Walden's Master of Arts in Teaching program is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a teacher in Maryland. Students should contact the Maryland State Department of Education to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a teacher; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a teacher in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## Master of Social Work (MSW)

Walden's Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC) in Maryland. Students should contact the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a LCPC; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a LCPC in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## MS in Education – Educational Leadership & Administration (Principal Preparation)

Walden's MS in Education – Educational Leadership & Administration (Principal Licensure Preparation) program is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a school principal in Maryland. Students should contact the Maryland State Department of Education to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a school principal; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a school principal in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## MS in Nursing – Nurse Practitioner Specializations

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Walden's Master of Science in Nursing program's nurse practitioner specializations are designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates with an active registered nurse (RN) license to be eligible to apply for licensure as nurse practitioners in Maryland. Students should contact the Maryland Board of Nursing to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a nurse practitioner; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a nurse practitioner in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## MS in Psychology – Applied Behavior Analysis

Walden's Master of Science in Psychology program's specialization in Applied Behavior Analysis is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a behavior analyst in Maryland with additional coursework or other requirements. Students should contact the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a behavior analyst; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a behavior analyst in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## MS in School Counseling

Walden's Master of Science in School Counseling program is designed to meet the academic requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure as a school counselor in Maryland with additional coursework. Students should contact the Maryland State Department of Education to determine specific requirements. Walden enrollment advisors can provide general guidance relating to the state-by-state requirements for practice as a school counselor; however, it remains the individual student's responsibility to understand, evaluate, and comply with all current requirements relating to the practice as a school counselor in the state in which he or she resides as requirements vary widely.

## Nurse Practitioner Certificates

Currently Post-Master's Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) Certificate, Adult Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner (AGPC-NP) Certificate, Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (AGAC-NP) Certificate, and Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMH-NP) graduates must hold a master's, doctoral degree, or a postgraduate certificate from a program accredited by CCNE or the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) in order to practice as a nurse practitioner and to be eligible for one of the Nurse Practitioner national certification exams, which is required in order to practice as an NP in most states. Walden University's FNP, AGPC-NP, AGAC-NP, and PMH-NP Certificate programs are not accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). While Walden's Master of Science in Nursing program and all of its specializations are accredited by Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), and have been for many years, the CCNE requires an on-site review of all new Nurse Practitioner Certificate programs. Walden has a site-visit scheduled with CCNE in March, 2020 and the FNP, AGPC-NP, AGAC-NP, and PMH-NP certificates will be reviewed by CCNE during the on-site visit. Pursuing CCNE accreditation does not guarantee that accreditation will be granted.



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## WALDEN CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY

The university refunds tuition and fees according to these policies and in accordance with applicable federal regulations. Students receiving federal financial assistance will have funds returned to the appropriate lending agencies in accordance with applicable federal guidelines. Federal aid that may have been awarded to students may be adjusted by reducing, reallocating or returning funds to federal programs if disbursement has already occurred.

### Course-Based Programs:

#### Dropping Courses

Students who drop courses during the drop/add period will receive an account credit. Students may request a refund of any resulting credit balance on their student account by submitting an e-mail request to [refund@mail.waldenu.edu](mailto:refund@mail.waldenu.edu).

The withdrawal date for federal financial aid purposes is not the same as the withdrawal date processed by the Office of the Registrar to determine tuition adjustments. Federal student aid may not cover all charges due to the university that result from the return of funds upon the student's withdrawal, and students may owe a balance to Walden.

Prior to withdrawing or making any enrollment changes, students should contact the Office of Financial Aid to determine if the change will result in a return of funds and to understand the financial options to get back on track for future terms.

#### Tuition Refunds

[Tuition reductions](#) are applied to the current term and may not be retroactively applied for any reason (see also [Tuition Reduction Benefits](#)). Students should review their current billing statement to ensure that their tuition reduction has been applied appropriately. If students have any questions, they should contact their Enrollment Advisor.

Refunds resulting from a student's withdrawal from courses and/or the university are based upon the effective withdrawal date (as confirmed by the Office of the Registrar). Residency fees are nonrefundable after 10 calendar days before the residency start date.

## **Competency-Based Programs:**

### **Withdrawal Policies**

1. A student may withdraw from a subscription term at any time, but will be required to sit out the remainder of that term before returning to study.
2. If a student has Agreed-to credits for the term and chooses to withdraw, the Agreed-to credits will be counted toward Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) and used in future calculations.
3. No notations of a withdrawal from a term or from the program are present on unofficial or official transcripts.
4. If a student decides to withdraw from a term, he or she will not be subject to the 30-day nonengagement policy during the withdrawal period. Their requirement to participate will restart upon the beginning of their next term.
