This articulation agreement is between Horry Georgetown Technical College (HGTC) and Walden University.

HGTC students who successfully complete courses listed in the tables below with a grade of 'C' or better *and* meet the requirements for admission to the respective Walden Bachelor degree program may receive credit. All credits will be converted to the equivalent value for Walden credit.

Important Note: Courses indicated on these tables will be fulfilled, but there may be outstanding credit. Walden requires that 45 of the last 90 quarter credits earned for a bachelor's degree be earned at Walden University. Transfer of credit is subject to change based on curriculum updates by academic leadership.

Courses transferred in to Walden are subject to Transfer of Credit policies including the conversion of semester to quarter credit (1; 1.5) and grade requirements. Students may have credits to make up in their general elective requirement if courses transfer in for less than 5 quarter credit hours.

Undergraduate Transfer of Credit Policy Revision Courses that equate to a General Education or Program Specific course will now come into the General Elective area as the Walden equivalent. Courses that are only General Elective and do not equate to a General Education or Program Specific course will remain in transfer at face value.
