

## **Jersey College Articulation Guide**

(Jersey College has four campus locations: Tampa, FL; Jacksonville, FL; Fort Lauderdale, FL; Ewing, NJ; Teterboro, NJ.)

This articulation agreement is between Jersey College and Walden University.

Students who successfully complete courses listed in the tables below with a grade of 'C' or better *and* meet the requirements for admission to Walden's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Completion program may receive credit. *All credits will be converted to the equivalent value for Walden credit.* 

**Important Note:** Courses indicated on these tables will be fulfilled, but there may be outstanding credit. Walden requires that 45 of the last 90 quarter credits earned for a bachelor's degree be earned at Walden University. Transfer of credit is subject to change based on curriculum updates by academic leadership.
