

# **Penn Foster College Articulation Guide**

This articulation agreement is between Penn Foster and Walden University.

Penn Foster students who successfully complete courses listed in the tables below with a grade of 'C' or better and meet the requirements for admission to the respective Walden Bachelor degree program may receive credit. All credits will be converted to the equivalent value for Walden credit.

**Important Note:** Courses indicated on these tables will be fulfilled, but there may be outstanding credit. Walden requires that 45 of the last 90 quarter credits earned for a bachelor's degree be earned at Walden University. Transfer of credit is subject to change based on curriculum updates by academic leadership.
