

2023-2024 Walden University Financial Aid Cost of Attendance (COA) Allowances for Tempo Programs

Independent Students

The Financial Aid Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of the total cost that an individual would incur to attend school. This includes charges posted to your student account (direct costs) as well as estimated costs not charged by Walden University but that you may incur while attending school (indirect costs). Walden University uses information from the Bureau of Labor and Statistics to develop averages for indirect costs like housing and food. While these averages may not exactly represent what you may spend on indirect costs, they do provide a basis on which to estimate your financial need while attending school.

- Tempo programs use the non-term financial aid academic year which is defined as 52 weeks and a set number of credits based on the program. Both weeks and credits must be completed to progress to a new academic year. The Cost of Attendance below is based on a 52-week academic year. The financial Aid COA will be reduced for remaining academic years shorter than the 52-week academic year but not increased if the academic year is extended beyond 52 weeks while the student is completing the minimum credits in the academic year. The COA used to determine your financial aid amount is displayed on your Walden myFinAid Portal.
- The living allowance is based on national economic data that reflects housing, food, transportation, personal and internet costs associated with time in school for working adults. The amount is based on weeks enrolled in the 52-week academic year and will be reduced if the students' academic year is shorter than 52-weeks.
- If there is an overlapping loan with another school, Walden will remove the indirect costs for the overlapping period.
- The financial aid academic year may not align with subscription billing periods.
